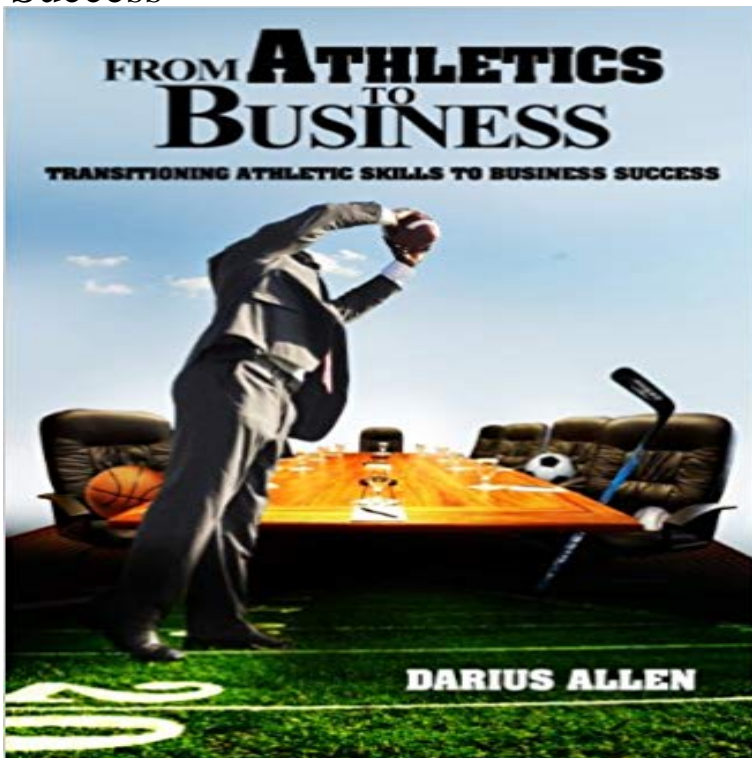


# From Athletics to Business: Transitioning Athletics Skills to Business Success
